### INTRODUCTION

1. Decisions on the IPCC Trust Fund Programme and Budget contained in Annex 1 to the draft Report of the 43<sup>rd</sup> Session of the Panel include an approved 2016 budget, a forecast 2017 budget and indicative budgets for 2018 and 2019. **Annex 5** to this document provides the approved 2016 budget, **Annex 6** contains a revised proposed budget for 2017, **Annex 7** provides a forecast 2018 budget and **Annex 8** contains an indicative 2019 budget. Annexes 1 through 8 relate to the IPCC Trust Fund only. It should be noted that there are other resources available to the IPCC, notably support services provided by the World Meteorological Organization (WMO) and the United Nations Environment Programme (UNEP), including the provision of the two senior posts in the IPCC Secretariat, generous contributions by the Governments of France, Germany, India, Japan, Peru, South Africa and the United Kingdom which are supporting Technical Support Units (TSUs), support from all those Governments and Organizations which host IPCC meetings and events and make experts available to the IPCC and voluntary "in-kind" contributions from the Governments of Germany, the United Kingdom and the United States of America to support the operation of the IPCC Data Distribution Centre.

2. We acknowledge the generous in-kind contribution made by the Government of Thailand for the organization of the 44<sup>th</sup> Plenary Session of the Panel.

3. This budget document contains two parts. Part A presents the status of income and expenditure for the Trust Fund. Part B includes the approved 2016 budget, the proposed 2017 budget, the forecast budget for 2018 and indicative budget for 2019.

### PART A – INCOME AND EXPENDITURE

4. **Annex 1** provides an update as of 31 July 2016 of the annual rate of voluntary cash contributions from governments and the European Union, and contributions from WMO, UNEP and the United Nations Framework Convention on Climate Change (UNFCCC) to the IPCC Trust Fund since its inception. **Annex 2** represents the monthly breakdown of contributions received in 2016 as of 31 July 2016. The interim statement of comparison of budget and actual amount as at 31 July 2016 is presented in **Annex 3**. A list of in-kind contributions/activities for the period January to July 2016 is attached as **Annex 4** 

5. The audited 2015 annual financial statements are presented in document IPCC-XLIV/INF. 1.

### PART B: BUDGETS

6. The standard costs for the budget preparation are as follows: the budgetary requirement for a Panel session has been established at CHF 70,000 per day. The requirement for sessions of the IPCC Bureau has been established at CHF 30,000 per day. The established rate for travel costs is CHF 4,000 per trip and 17 per cent of total travel costs are to be utilized to cover meeting costs.

7. The budget proposals for the coming years are using the same standard costs as were used for the preparation of the revised budget for the year 2016, the proposed forecast budget for the year 2017 and the indicative budgets for 2017 and 2018 noted at the 43<sup>rd</sup> Plenary Session.

8. **Annex 5** contains the approved 2016 budget.

9. **Annex 6** contains the proposed 2017 budget to be approved by the Panel. Major changes to the budget noted by IPCC-43 include:

- Addition of "Scoping Meeting (SR 2)" budget line; increase of CHF 234,000.
- Addition of SR 1-LA 3 meeting from 2018 to 2017 to budget line "SR 1–LA 1 and LA 2" and renamed as budget line "SR 1-LA 1, LA 2 and LA 3"; increase of CHF 210,600.
- Move of SR 2-LA 2 meeting from 2017 to 2018 and budget line renamed as "SR 2-LA 1"; decrease of CHF 210,600.
- Move of SR-3-LA 2 meeting from 2017 to 2018 and budget line renamed as "SR 3-LA 1"; decrease of CHF 210,600.
- Addition of budget line "TGICA staff position"; increase of CHF 177,650.
- Addition of budget line "IPCC-45 1 day Briefing for developing countries"; increase of CHF 70,000.
- Addition of budget line "IPCC-46, I day briefing for developing countries"; increase of CHF 70,000.
- 10. **Annex 7** contains the forecast budget for 2018.
- 11. The indicative budget for 2019 is contained in **Annex 8**.
- 12. Annex 9 provides the Provisional Agenda of the Financial Task Team (FiTT).
