Webcast and live feed of IPCC Press Conference

COPENHAGEN, Oct 30 – The Intergovernmental Panel on Climate Change (IPCC) is holding a press conference at 11.00 a.m. Copenhagen time on Sunday 2 November 2014 to present the Synthesis Report of the Fifth Assessment Report.

IPCC Chairman Rajendra Pachauri will present the Synthesis Report. He will be joined by U.N. Secretary-General Ban Ki-moon and Peruvian Environment Minister (and incoming COP President) Manuel Pulgar-Vidal. The panel also includes World Meteorological Organization Michel Jarraud and IPCC Secretary Renate Christ. Authors that have contributed to the report will be present.

This press conference will be webcast and can be followed live.

Media representatives wishing to attend the press conference and/or get access to embargo materials must complete the online form available on the IPCC media portal here: <http://www.ipcc.ch/apps/eventmanager/press/>.

Please ensure that you have scanned copies of your credentials ready when you start filling in the form as the system will not allow you to proceed without uploading these. **Credentials should be uploaded in a single file (PDF).**

The credentials that are required are:

- **A letter of assignment** requesting accreditation on official letterhead of a media organization, signed by the publisher, editor-in-chief, or assignment editor. It should include the name and duration of assignment of the journalist; and

- A **valid press card**; or a valid media accreditation badge for the United Nations in New York, Geneva, Vienna or Nairobi. If you do not have a press card, please submit **3 recent samples of your work** in a relevant area.

On the IPCC media portal, follow the following steps:

- Click "Request Access"
- Read carefully the conditions and click "Yes I agree to respect the terms of the embargo", if you agree
- Fill in the "Request Access" form:
 - Select the event;
 - Select from the following options: opening session; press conference, embargo. You can choose one, two or all options;
 - Upload your credentials in a single PDF file;
 - Click "Request Access" to submit the form.

The IPCC media team will review your credentials and when approved you will receive an email with your personal log-in details. Please note that due to the high number of requests, this might take a number of days.

Many IPCC **authors will be available for interview** after the press conference on Sunday, in person or by phone.
