

OUTREACH EVENT ON THE IPCC FIFTH ASSESSMENT REPORT

DATE: 28-29 August 2015

VENUE: Managua, Crowne Plaza Hotel

Concept: Outreach event focusing on AR5 findings (WGI, II and III and Synthesis Report), how they are being manifested in Nicaragua and the potential solutions.

Target audience: Policymakers at national, state and city government level; climate and disaster risk management community; business leaders and organizations; civil society organizations; local science and research community; media.

Objectives

- To raise awareness, especially among policymakers, about the outcomes of the IPCC's Fifth Assessment Report (AR5), demonstrate how they are and will affect Nicaragua and highlight solutions to the challenges of climate change.
- To enlist the participation of the local science and research community in climate research.
- To **foster a better understanding among the news media** about climate science, solutions to climate change and the IPCC process.
