1. ADOPTION OF THE AGENDA

The Executive Committee took note of the oral report of the Co-Chair of Working Group I and it was agreed that the Chair of the Scientific Steering Committee will keep the Executive Committee updated on progress.

2.2. Arrangements for scoping the Special Report on climate change, desertification, land degradation, sustainable land management, food security, and greenhouse gas fluxes in terrestrial ecosystems.

The Secretariat introduced the Terms of Reference for the Steering Committee for scoping the Special Report on climate change, desertification, land degradation, sustainable land management, food security and greenhouse gas fluxes in terrestrial ecosystems.

It was agreed that Mr Youba Sokona, IPCC Vice Chair, will chair the Scientific Steering committee and will prepare an amended version of the draft Terms of Reference of the Scientific Steering Committee for the consideration of the Executive Committee at its next meeting.

It was agreed that it would be desirable to involve the United Nations Convention to Combat Desertification (UNCCD) and the Food and Agriculture Organization (FAO) in the production of this Special Report.

It was agreed that the Secretariat should send a reminder to the member States and observer organizations on the 10 June deadline for submitting nominations for experts to participate in the scoping meeting.

It was agreed that the Secretariat should send a letter to the member States and observer organizations inviting them to submit ideas on issues and key questions to be addressed in the scoping of AR6, with a deadline of the end of September 2016.
