1. ADOPTION OF THE AGENDA

The Provisional Agenda (EXCOM-XLI/Doc.1), as attached in Annex 1, was adopted adding, under Any Other Matters, an agenda item on a "FAO Soil Organic Carbon (SOC) symposium" and a second agenda item on "Roles, responsibilities and working arrangements between the IPCC Secretariat and the Technical Support Units".

2. URGENT ISSUES RELATED TO IPCC PRODUCTS AND PROGRAMME OF WORK THAT REQUIRE PROMPT ATTENTION BY THE IPCC BETWEEN PANEL SESSIONS

2.1. Arrangements for scoping the Special Report on the impacts of global warming of 1.5 °C above pre-industrial levels and related global greenhouse gas emission pathways, in the context of strengthening the global response to the threat of climate change, sustainable development and efforts to eradicate poverty.

Ms Thelma Krug, Chair of the Steering Committee for scoping the Special Report reported on the state of play in the selection of experts to participate in the scoping meeting to be held in Geneva from 15 to 18 (a.m) August 2016. The Secretariat reported on the state of play regarding the logistics for the organization of the scoping meeting.

The Executive Committee discussed how to improve the balance among experts to be invited to the scoping meeting regarding scientific, technical and socio-economic expertise; geographical representation; a mixture of experts with and without previous experience in IPCC; gender balance; and experts with a background from various stakeholder and user groups. The Executive Committee also discussed how to enhance the participation of experts from developing countries, mindful that the IPCC budget would allow providing travelling support to up to 50 experts from developing countries and countries with economies in transition.

The Executive Committee agreed that the Steering Committee should make recommendations to the WG Bureaux in these regards.

2.2. Arrangements for scoping the Special Report on climate change, desertification, land degradation, sustainable land management, food security, and greenhouse gas fluxes in terrestrial ecosystems.

The Secretariat introduced the revised draft Terms of Reference for the Scientific Steering Committee for scoping the Special Report on climate change, desertification, land degradation, sustainable land management, food security and greenhouse gas fluxes in terrestrial ecosystems.

The Executive Committee approved the Terms of Reference as attached in Annex 2.

2.3. Arrangements for scoping the Special Report on climate change and oceans and the cryosphere.

The Secretariat introduced the revised draft Terms of Reference for the Scientific Steering Committee for scoping the Special Report on climate change and oceans and the cryosphere.

The Secretariat reported on recent contacts with the Principality of Monaco regarding its financial support to the Special Report.

The Executive Committee approved the Terms of Reference as attached in Annex 3 and took note of the reports.

2.4. Schedule and arrangements for scoping the Methodology Report on Greenhouse Gas Inventories.

Mr Kiyoto Tanabe, Co-Chair of the Task Force Bureau, gave an oral report on progress in the preparations for the scoping meeting, including the process of selection of experts to be invited to the scoping meeting.

The Secretariat reported that the negotiations regarding the Host Country Agreement with Republic of Belarus have successfully concluded.

The Executive Committee took note of the reports.

3. COMMUNICATIONS AND OUTREACH ACTIVITIES

The Secretariat reported on recent outreach activities in Switzerland (Chair of IPCC report to the WMO Executive Council (WMO-EC), WMO-EC side event and Event at the Palais des Nations hosted by their Excellences the Ambassadors of France and of the Republic of Korea), and in Mali. The Secretariat also reported on ongoing plans for outreach activities in Cuba, Ecuador (HABITAT III Conference), Fiji, Jamaica, Thailand and Vietnam.

The Executive Committee took note of the report.

4. RESPONSE TO POSSIBLE ERRORS IN COMPLETED ASSESSMENTS AND OTHER IPCC PRODUCTS

4.1. Update on the implementation of the Error Protocol.

The Secretariat introduced this agenda item and the Executive Committee took note of the report.

5. COORDINATION BETWEEN WORKING GROUPS AND TASK FORCES ON ACTIVITIES AND ISSUES PERTAINING TO THE PRODUCTION OF ASSESSMENTS AND OTHER RELEVANT IPCC PRODUCTS

5.1. Strategic Planning Schedule for the Sixth Assessment Report cycle.

The Secretariat introduced the revised Strategic Planned Schedule for the Sixth Assessment Report cycle, developed in collaboration with the four Technical Support Units.

The Executive Committee approved the Strategic Planning Schedule as contained in Annex 4. The Executive Committee agreed that this Strategic Planning Schedule should be transmitted for information to the National Focal Points and the observer organizations.

The Executive Committee agreed to have a preliminary exchange of views on how to handle scientific contents in the Sixth Assessment Report under the agenda Item "Any Other Matters" of its next meeting.

6. ANY OTHER MATTERS

6.1. FAO Soil Organic Carbon (SOC) symposium.

Mr Jim Skea, Co-Chair of Working Group III reported on recent contacts with the Food and Agriculture Organization (FAO) regarding their proposals for the IPCC to Co-sponsor two different symposia: a symposium on Soil Organic Carbon and a symposium on Climate Change, Land Use and Food Security.

The Executive Committee agreed that the Scientific Steering Committee for the scoping of the Special Report on climate change, desertification, land degradation, sustainable land management, food security and greenhouse gas fluxes in terrestrial ecosystems should provide advice on how to respond to the kind proposals from FAO. Thereafter the Secretariat should respond to FAO in writing.

6.2. Roles, responsibilities and working arrangements between the IPCC Secretariat and the Technical Support Units

At the request of Mr Skea the Secretariat updated the Executive Committee on initiatives to clarify the roles, responsibilities and working arrangements between the IPCC Secretariat and the Technical Support Units, as requested in the 2015 Resolution 6.2/1 (Cg-17) of the World Meteorological Organization Congress and in paragraph 18 of Decision IPCC/XLI.

The Executive Committee agreed to continue following up on this matter.

Scientific Steering Committee for the scoping of the IPCC Special Report on 'Climate change and land use¹'

Terms of Reference

Introduction

1. In Paragraph 3 of Decision IPCC/XLIII-6 on the Sixth Assessment Report Products -Special Reports - the Panel decided:

To prepare a Special Report on climate change, desertification, land degradation, sustainable land management, food security, and greenhouse gas fluxes in terrestrial ecosystems. The scoping process may consider challenges and opportunities for both adaptation and mitigation.

2. In Paragraph 2 of Decision IPCC/XLIII-7 on the Sixth Assessment Report Products – Strategic Planning – the Panel decided:

To consider the outline of the Special Report on climate change, desertification, land degradation, sustainable land management, food security and greenhouse gas fluxes in terrestrial ecosystems at the 45th Session of the IPCC in 2017.

3. In Paragraph 1 of Decision IPCC/XLIII-10 on Communications for the Sixth Assessment Report (AR6) the Panel decided :

To request the respective Working Group Bureau, or in the case of the Synthesis Report, the IPCC Chair, in preparing a scoping meeting:

- to engage with governments and a wide range of stakeholders in the scoping process, seek greater input from stakeholder groups in the scoping process, and identify, with the help of governments and observer organizations, audiences and stakeholders who can provide input;
- to consider different options to enable stakeholders to contribute to the scoping process, for instance through a call for submissions or other pre-scoping contacts;
- 4. The Special Report will be developed under the joint scientific leadership of Working Groups I, II, III and the Task Force on Inventories (TFI) with support from the Working Group III Technical Support Unit.
- 5. The Government of Ireland has offered to host the Scoping Meeting in Dublin in the week commencing 13 February 2017.
- 6. The Chair of the IPCC herein establishes a Scientific Steering Committee (SSC) to lead the scoping of the Special Report.

¹ The term "Land use" is used to denote all of the elements covered in Paragraph 3 of Decision IPCC/XLIII-6 and is without prejudice to the final scope of the report decided by the Panel.

- 8. The Chair of the SSC may appoint a vice-chair in consultation with the WG-III Co-chairs. The Vice-chair will chair meetings in the absence of the Chair.
- 9. The SSC may invite additional members after consultations with leading scientific bodies.

Mandate

- 10. The role of the SSC is to support the convening of and reporting on the scoping meeting for the Special Report in accordance with paragraph 4.1 of Appendix A to the Principles Governing IPCC Work, "Procedures for the Preparation, Review, Acceptance, Adoption, Approval and Publication of IPCC Reports".
- 11. The specific mandate of the SSC is as follows:
 - a. To facilitate the process by which the IPCC Bureau² selects participants to be invited by the Secretariat to the Scoping Meeting.
 - b. To prepare the draft agenda for the Scoping Meeting.
 - c. To prepare the necessary documentation to inform the Scoping Meeting, taking into account different options to enable stakeholders to contribute to the scoping process, for instance through a call for submissions or other pre-scoping contacts.
 - d. To prepare a document with the outcomes of the Scoping Meeting to be transmitted, through the Secretariat, to the 45th Session of the Panel for their consideration.

² The IPCC principles refer to "relevant respective Working Group Bureau/Task Force Bureau". As the Special Report Is under the scientific leadership of of Working Groups I, II, III and the TFI, the selection will be made by the whole Bureau.

Mode of Operation

- 12. The SSC will meet by Webex or similar means, or physically as circumstances permit, as often as is necessary to fulfil its mandate.
- 13. The SSC may form sub-committees to advance aspects of its work. However, all decisions are taken by the SSC a whole.
- 14. The SSC will strive to reach consensus in making decisions. In the event that consensus does not emerge, the Chair of the SSC will make the decision in consultation with the co-chairs of WG-III which is supporting the production of the Special Report.
- 15. The work of the SSC will cease when the Panel has agreed the scope and outline of the Special Report and has agreed the work plan including schedule and budget.
