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IPCC TRUST FUND PROGRAMME AND BUDGET

Statement of Expenditure as at 31 December 2010

(Submitted by the IPCC Secretariat)



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INTRODUCTION

- 1. Reference is made to document IPCC-XXXIII/Doc.2. This document contains Part A which presents the income and expenditure for the IPCC Trust Fund as of 31 December 2010.
- 2. As part of the fundraising efforts for the IPCC Trust Fund, the Secretary sent out fundraising letters to Governments on 14 April 2010.

PART A – INCOME AND EXPENDITURE

- 3. The standard costs for the budget preparation are as follows: the budgetary requirement for a Panel session has been established in the past at CHF 70,000 per day. The requirement for sessions of the IPCC Bureau has been established at CHF 30,000 per day. With regard to travel costs, the established rate is CHF 4,500 per trip and 15 per cent of total travel costs are to be used for other meeting costs.
- 4. **Table 1** provides an overview of expenses against the annual budget for the four main categories of IPCC activities, namely governing bodies; lead authors, scoping and expert meetings for reports agreed by the Panel; other scoping meetings, expert meetings and workshops; and other expenditures. The original budget for 2010 was revised downwards from CHF 7,457,725 to CHF 6,582,450 as a result of the postponement of three meetings from 2010 to 2011. The 2010 revised budget was approved by IPCC-32. Total expenditures show as CHF 4,963,013 which leaves an unspent balance of CHF 1,619,437 of the allocated budget.
- 5. **Table 2** provides a summary of the status of income and expenditures, as of 31 December 2010, for the IPCC Trust Fund and **Table 3** provides a summary of the status of the Nobel Peace Prize Fund. Overall savings for the IPCC Trust Fund amount to CHF 12,662,843. Income level recorded for the IPCC Nobel Peace Prize stands at CHF 1,048,066.

Main comments on expenditures by category are as follows:

- Category A: With regard to Plenary Sessions, savings were made due to the generous support by the host country. We acknowledge the generous contribution made by the Republic of Korea for hosting the 2010 session.
- Category B: Savings can be attributed to unused slots for meetings and underutilisation of the allotment set aside for other expenditure to cover meeting costs.
 The over-expenditures are as a result of the cancellation of three meetings which were postponed to 2011 against which some obligations had been raised.
- Category C: Savings in this category stem from lower fares obtained due to advanced planning and under utilisation of the allotment set aside for other expenditure to cover meeting costs.
- Category D: The over-expenditure under "Secretariat" is due to expenses incurred for the acting Deputy Secretary pending the completion of the recruitment process. This over-expenditure will be refunded by UNEP. Over expenditure under "outreach" is mainly due to expenses for sick leave replacement for the Information Officer and the fact that WMO did not allow charging these expenditures to the "WMO Special Fund" to which IPCC contributes.

OTHER ISSUES

- 6. Four Task Groups were established at IPCC-32 to review the implementation of the recommendations by the InterAcademy Council. A decision was taken to create a budget line to cover 25 journeys. The IPCC Trust Fund received an additional contribution from Germany in the amount of EUR 200,000 (equivalent to CHF 262,172.80) in support of the work of the Task Groups. We acknowledge the generous contribution made by Germany, which enabled the IPCC Secretariat to authorize travel for all DC/EIT government representatives wishing to participate in meetings of the Task Groups held from 1-4 February, 2011 in Geneva.
- 7. The 2010-11 biennium contribution from UNEP in the amount of USD 417,500 is broken down as follows: USD 331,100 covers UNEP's contribution to the Independent Review of the IPCC and USD 86,400 covers the costs of the Legal/Outreach consultant.
- 8. The status of the Nobel Peace Prize Fund is further considered under agenda item 10.5.
