REPLACEMENT OF MEMBERS OF THE IPCC BUREAU

1. Background

By letter of 26 November 2009 the IPCC Secretary was informed by the Government of Sierra Leone that Professor Ogunlade Davidson, Honourable Minister of Water and Energy of Sierra Leone, was no longer able to carry out his responsibilities as Vice-Chair of the IPCC and that the Government of Sierra Leone nominated Mr Ismail Elgizouli of Sudan to replace him in his position as Vice-Chair of the IPCC.

By letter of 13 January 2010 the Secretary of the IPCC requested the Focal Point of Sierra Leone to thank Professor Davidson for his long and outstanding leadership and contribution to the work and activities of the IPCC. With respect to the nomination of Mr Elgizouli to replace Professor Davidson the Secretary indicated that according to Rule 12 of the Rules of Procedures for the Election of the IPCC Bureau and Any Task Force Bureau (hereafter: the Election Rules), Members have the right to nominate "a representative of the same Member of the IPCC" as replacement for a Bureau member. The nominated person shall replace the Bureau member as acting member until the next Session of the Panel, at which Session a new member will be elected for the remainder of the term of the Bureau. If the relevant Member of the IPCC is unable to nominate a replacement within six months a new member from the same region shall be elected by the Panel. Since the Government of Sierra Leone has nominated Mr Elgizouli from Sudan to replace Professor Davidson, Mr Elgizouli could according to the current Rules be elected for the remainder term of the Bureau at the 32nd Session of the Panel, 11-14 October 2010, Busan, Republic of Korea, but not serve as acting member before that Session. However, since Mr Elgizouli was already a member of the IPCC Bureau and as acting member would just assume additional responsibilities, the Secretary informed the Focal Point of Sierra Leone that she would seek the advice and consent from the Members of the IPCC to accept by way of exception, the nomination of Mr Elgizouli of Sudan to replace Professor Davidson as acting Vice-Chair during the intermediate period, i.e. until the 32nd Plenary Session of the IPCC.

Consequently by letter of 2 February 2010 the Secretary requested Members to indicate before 31 March 2010 if they had any objection to the proposed nomination of Mr Elgizouli as acting Vice-Chair of the IPCC.

By letter of 12 April 2010 the Secretary informed the Members that no objection was received to her proposal to replace Professor Davidson as Vice-Chair of the IPCC by Mr Elgizouli of Sudan until the 32nd Plenary Session, at which Session elections would be held. In addition to his assignment as Vice-Chair, Mr Elgizouli would, for the time being, continue his duties as Vice-Chair of Working Group III.

By letter of 15 June 2010 the Secretary informed the Members that the 32nd Plenary Session is supposed to take a final decision about the candidature of Mr Elgizouli for the post of Vice-Chair of the IPCC. In case he will be elected, there will be the need to fill the vacancy of the Vice-Chair of Working Group III, which Mr Elgizouli will leave behind. In line with Rule 7 of the Election Rules, pertaining to the need for a balanced geographic balance in the composition of the IPCC Bureau and Annex B to the Rules, which indicate that the Bureau will include five representatives of Africa (Region I), the Members were invited in accordance with Rule 18 to submit nominations.

2. Nominations received from Governments

In response to the letter of the Secretary of 15 June 2010, nominations for the Vice-Chair of Working Group III were received from the Government of South Africa, indicating by letter dated 27 July 2010 that they would support the candidature of Mr Francis Yamba from Zambia or Mr Anthony Adegbulugbe from Nigeria in case their respective Governments, i.e. Zambia and Nigeria, would nominate them. By letter dated 5 August 2010 the Government of Senegal nominated Mr Chérif Diop for the position of Vice-Chair of Working Group III.

For reference of the Panel the nomination letters of the Governments are attached to this document.
