COMMUNICATION AND OUTREACH ACTIVITIES

Past and planned communications activities

This document reviews communications activities since the 40th Session of the Panel, and complements the report from the Secretariat on this subject to the 40th Session of the Panel (IPCC-XL/Doc. 9, dated 25 September 2014).

Communications Strategy

The Communications Action Team (CAT), set up under the Communications Strategy, has met regularly to review communications activities and reported to the Executive Committee.

Outreach events since the 40th Session of the Panel

• Release of the Synthesis Report

The Synthesis Report of the Fifth Assessment Report (AR5) was presented at a webcast press conference in Copenhagen, Denmark, on 2 November 2014, with the participation of UN Secretary-General Ban Ki-moon and Peruvian Environment Minister and incoming COP President H.E. Manuel Pulgar-Vidal.

The press conference and subsequent intensive programme of interviews resulted in widespread and comprehensive coverage of the Synthesis Report for several days. As with the Working Group II and III reports, the press release and Summary for Policymakers were made available to registered media under embargo a day in advance, allowing electronic and broadcast media to cover the report in detail as the press conference started.

Particular efforts were made to ensure coverage by broadcasters and by media in developing countries.

A series of outreach events immediately following the release of the Synthesis Report included presentations by the Chair of the IPCC to an event in Switzerland on 3 November, to the European Parliament in Brussels on 4 November, and to French stakeholders including French Foreign Minister H.E. Laurent Fabius and Environment Minister H.E. Ségolène Royal on 5 November.

While the IPCC and climate science in general attract criticism in some blogs, the vast majority of media coverage has treated the IPCC and AR5 as authoritative.

• IPCC activities at COP20 of the United Nations Framework Convention on Climate Change (UNFCCC) and at the meeting in Geneva in February 2015 of the Ad Hoc Working Group on the Durban Platform for Enhanced Action (ADP)

During the UNFCCC COP20 in Lima, Peru, the IPCC was involved in and organized the following events:

IPCC Chair R.K. Pachauri gave a statement during the opening ceremony on 1 December 2014, and gave a presentation at the Lima Climate Action High-Level Meeting, organized by the UN Secretary-General, on 11 December 2014.

The Secretary of the IPCC, Ms Renate Christ, delivered a brief statement at the opening plenary of SBSTA 41 on 1 December 2014 to update delegates about IPCC activities.

On 2 December 2014 the Synthesis Report of AR5 was presented at a SBSTA-IPCC special event with presentations by Gian-Kasper Plattner, Vicente Barros, Chris Field, Ms Katie Mach, Ottmar Edenhofer and Ramón Pichs Madruga.

On 2 December 2014 IPCC experts participated in the fourth meeting of the Structured Expert Dialogue on the 2013-2015 review (SED 4), Part 1. Scientific presentations were given by Hans-Otto Pörtner, Ms Petra Tschakert, Ottmar Edenhofer and Ramón Pichs Madruga.

IPCC experts participated as resource persons at the fourth meeting of the Structured Expert Dialogue on the 2013-2015 review (SED 4), Part 2, on 3 December 2014.

On 3 December 2014 an IPCC side event on "The IPCC Fifth Assessment Report: A User's Perspective" was organized with presentations by Nebojsa Nakicenovic, International Institute for Applied Systems Analysis (IIASA); Rabelani Tshikalanke, Department of Environmental Affairs, Republic of South Africa; David Hone, Shell Research Ltd; and Enrique Maurtua Konstantinidis, Climate Action Network Latin America.

On 8 and 9 February 2015 IPCC experts participated in the fourth meeting of the Structured Expert Dialogue on the 2013-2015 review (SED 5), Part 2. Ms Renate Christ, Axel Michaelowa, Guy Midgley and Thomas Stocker took part in the discussion. Leonard Nurse (Coordinating Lead Author of Working Gorup II) gave a scientific presentation on behalf of the Caribbean Community Climate Change Centre (CCCCC).

Other outreach activities

The IPCC expresses thanks to host countries for the provision of facilities for outreach activities and other in-kind contributions.

A regional launch for Africa was held on 10-11 November 2014, preceded by a media workshop on 9 November, hosted by South Africa and with support from the Federal Government of Germany and Climate and Development Knowledge Network (CDKN). Speakers included vice-chairs, co-chairs and local authors. The IPCC and partners funded the participation of delegates and media from neighbouring countries to ensure the regional nature of the event. The event was timed to coincide with South Africa's own national climate conference in the same location, resulting in a strong participation from South Africa itself.

Also on 10 November, AR5 was presented to an audience in Yogyakarta, Indonesia, at an event co-sponsored by CDKN, with the participation of Bureau member Fredolin Tangang and authors from each working group. The Chair presented the Synthesis Report to audiences in Oslo, Norway, on 12 November, and the Secretary presented AR5 to a forestry conference of the UNECE/FAO in Kazan, Russian Federation on 18 November and to the Hungarian Academy of Sciences in Budapest, Hungary, on 21 November.

During COP20 on 8 December, but outside the venue of the conference, an outreach event for Peruvian stakeholders was held together with Universidad Nacional Mayor de San Marcos, with the participation of bureau member Eduardo Calvo, with presentations by the Chair, Co-Chairs, Secretary and other authors.

Authors from each Working Group presented AR5 at an event in Belgrade, Serbia, on 4 December.

The Co-Chairs, Vice-Chairs and Authors of the three Working Groups continued to support the outreach and communication of AR5 through invited talks and presentations as well as responding to requests by media.

Planned outreach events

The IPCC is planning an ambitious programme of outreach in 2015 to ensure the findings of AR5 remain prominent in the run-up to the negotiations at COP21 in Paris. Several member governments have promised additional support to the IPCC for these efforts, and generous contributions from Denmark, Norway and Sweden are gratefully acknowledged.

These funds are being held under a separate project line in the IPCC Trust Fund at the WMO.

The aim of this programme is to keep the Synthesis Report and other AR5 materials front and centre for policymakers at all levels and among other key stakeholders, including business leaders, the media and civil society. The outreach programme will ensure continued awareness and media coverage of AR5 and the Synthesis Report in particular, by making it relevant to specific geographic areas.

The plan envisages a series of events at key locations around the world in partnership with government and/or non-governmental bodies identified as local partners during the months leading up to COP21.

Representatives from local government, NGOs and civil society from the host countries will be invited and encouraged to complement the IPCC material with regional and local information revealing how they are already being affected by and dealing with climate change; their concerns for the future; and their ideas for creating a more sustainable future.

The core elements of each event are presentations of the report by IPCC authors and discussions with policymakers and authors, with plenty of space for Q&A. IN addition, and depending on local circumstances, there may be workshops for local scientists and the research community whose main purpose will be to build capacity by encouraging publication of scientific papers locally and participation by local scientists in the work of the IPCC as authors and reviewers. Media workshops may also be held to familiarize journalists from the region with the way the IPCC operates and produces reports and to discuss the basics of climate science.

The activities to be funded under this enhanced programme will build on traditional IPCC outreach through a series of sub-regional activities to maximize the impact of events and make the best use of available resources, both financial and speakers. At given events in developing countries, delegates and media will be invited from other countries in the region and their travel costs supported with the additional funding to help communicate the findings of AR5 throughout the region. The IPCC is also actively participating in events at the sub-national level, to communicate AR5 outside national capitals in other centres. The IPCC will also fund the participation of delegates from developing countries at certain events in developed countries.

Among activities already being planned are outreach events in Nairobi, Kenya on 23 February 2015, ahead of the IPCC Session, in Arusha, Tanzania, focusing on the local research community, on 28 February, and a regional event to be hosted by Morocco on 1-2 April, with participation of delegates and speakers from North Africa and francophone Africa. This follows a workshop for weathercasters being organized with the WMO in Paris on 31 March, following two successful workshops in 2014 for this critically important stakeholder group, at which the IPCC will provide speakers and fund delegates from developing countries.

Further sub-regional events are also planned in Latin America, the Caribbean, Southeast Asia and the Middle East.

Given the number and scope of the events being planned, the IPCC has issued a call for proposals for a partner to help with the logistics and implementation of these activities.

Rapid response

There were no communications events requiring a rapid response.

Other communications activities

• IPCC Videos

The Synthesis Report video, which also covered AR5 as a whole and looked at the way the IPCC produces reports, was launched at the IPCC/SBSTA special event at COP 20 on 2 December. A trailer was shown at the start of the Synthesis Report press conference on 2 November and the COP20 side event. The video, like the previous Working Group films, attracted much interest and was widely posted on social media. Our distributor, Green.tv, estimates that as of early January the video and trailer had each attracted about 35,000 views on different platforms.

The three working group videos have been subtitled into the other official UN languages (Arabic, Chinese, French, Russian and Spanish) and Working Group I is organizing a version of its video with German subtitles. Work is underway to produce subtitled versions of the Synthesis Report video.

Interviews

Besides the programme of interviews organized at the Synthesis Report launch, senior IPCC figures have given a large number of interviews, and the Secretariat has responded to specific specialist requests for information by putting journalists in touch with authors.

Social media

The Secretariat uses social media conservatively. Twitter and Facebook are used to disseminate links to press releases and similar materials, and to publicize outreach events, including illustrations of speakers and presentations. Twitter is also used to disseminate key findings from reports such as headline statements. The Scholarship Programme has its own Facebook page, which provides announcements about the programme and updates on the activities of individual scholarship-holders. The Secretariat is looking at the possibility of webcasting some outreach events.

Media monitoring

The Secretariat provides monthly reports to the Executive Committee and Bureau on communications activity and media coverage of the IPCC. These draw on data from a media monitoring company, to provide basic evaluation by counting the number of articles about the IPCC on online media and blogs, and rating them as positive, negative and neutral, depending on certain words appearing in the articles.

Translation

The Summaries for Policymakers and Technical Summary volumes of the AR5 Working Group reports and the Synthesis Report Summary for Policymakers and longer report are being translated into all official UN languages (besides English: Arabic, Chinese, French, Russian and Spanish) and these are posted on the IPCC website and made available for distribution in print form. Members are encouraged to undertake translations into other languages and send links to the electronic publications to the Secretariat for inclusion on the website.

The main press release for the Synthesis Report (as was previously the case with the Working Group contributions, was issued in all six UN languages. The AR5 videos for each working group have also been subtitled in all official UN languages besides English, and work on subtitling the Synthesis Report video is underway. A shorter version of the main pages of the IPCC website has also been prepared and translated into the official UN languages, and these translated pages are regularly updated.

Distribution

The Secretariat works with a distributor (SMI Distribution Services) to ensure that summary and full report volumes are available for distribution to users. (Full Working Group reports are available for purchase by users from developed countries but are free of charge to users in developing countries or economies in transition.) The Secretariat has also worked with the distributor to identify new user groups such as university and parliamentary libraries in developing countries, and has contacted these institutions to ensure they are aware of the materials that are available.

Website

The Secretariat is currently working with a software developer to improve the functionality of the website, to make it easier and simpler for non-specialist staff to add and update material. This project also involves improvements to search functionality, both for reports and for other material on the website. On completion of this work it is intended to seek proposals to upgrade the website and make it a more user-friendly experience with a more attractive and simpler appearance.

In the meantime a new section of the website to showcase the Synthesis Report in a user-friendly manner is under development. This will allow users to move simply between the Summary for Policymakers and longer report, and between the Synthesis Report and underlying Working Group contributions, while presenting the Synthesis Report in an attractive manner.

With the final publication of the Working Group contributions, work has begun to migrate material from the Technical Support Unit websites to AR5's permanent home at www.ipcc.ch.
