IPCC Sessions in Kampala, Uganda Special Report Approval and Launch: Managing the Risks of Extreme Weather Events

In November, the Intergovernmental Panel on Climate Change (IPCC) will convene two important sessions in Kampala, Uganda, namely the 1st Joint Session of Working Groups I and II (14-17 November 2011) and the 34th Session of the IPCC (18-19 November 2011). The 1st joint session of IPCC Working Groups I and II will consider the finalization of the Special Report on Managing the Risks of Extreme Events and Disasters to Advance Climate Change Adaptation.

In accordance with the IPCC procedures, the Summary for Policymakers (SPM) of the Special Report will be approved line by line by governments and the underlying assessment report, which runs to several hundred pages, will be presented for acceptance.

Media representatives are cordially invited to a **press conference** on 18 November 2011 where the findings of the Special Report will be presented and the Summary for Policymakers made available. The press conference will be held in English, and one-way interpretation in French and Spanish will be available.
