#### **Resource Mobilization**

#### **Background**

In 2016, the IPCC launched a resource mobilization campaign. Its main objective was to obtain sufficient funding from voluntary contributions to ensure the successful completion of the production of three special reports, a methodological report, the three Working Group contributions to the Sixth Assessment Report (AR6) and the AR6 Synthesis Report, as agreed in Decisions IPCC/XLIII-6 and IPCC/XLIII-7.

Over the past three years, the Member Governments of the IPCC have responded to the call for increased funding which has led to a marked growth in the balance of the IPCC Trust Fund.

#### **Resource Mobilization**

The IPCC is seeking to raise CHF 28.2 million to cover the estimated costs associated with the remainder of the AR6 cycle (2020-2022). For the period January to December 2019, the IPCC Trust Fund has received contributions from (a) first-time donors, (b) donors who made a contribution after having ceased contributing for several years, (c) donors who maintained their increased contribution from 2017, (d) donors who increased their contributions/made additional contribution(s) and (d) donor who made a first-time pledge.

Income received in 2019, as at 31 January 2020, stands at CHF 7,698,998 compared to CHF 8,123,056 received in 2018. The difference of CHF 424,058 is attributable to some donors who did not maintain the level of their 2018 contribution in 2019 or who made a substantial one-time contribution in 2018. A list of all the donors is attached as **Annex 1**. In spite of the slight decrease in contributions received in 2019 compared to 2018, it is reassuring to note that the number of Member Governments/organizations contributing has risen steadily from 22 in 2014 to 39 in 2018 with a slight drop to 37 in 2019 as presented in **Annex 2**. The steady rise in the number of donors since 2014 coupled with the recent show of commitments received from Member Governments and organizations reinforces the assurance that the level of annual contributions will rise in the coming years. As at 31 December 2019, outstanding pledges amount to CHF 34,500, as shown in **Annex 3**. Multi-year pledges covering the period 2020-2022 amount to CHF 5,915,326 as provided in **Annex 4**.

The Secretary of the IPCC recognizes with appreciation the Member Governments and organizations that made a contribution in 2019 and especially welcomes Liechtenstein, Russian Federation and Slovak Republic as first-time donors. Also recognized are Member Governments that increased their contributions, namely: Morocco (CHF 20,000), Norway (CHF 1,009,527) and Switzerland (CHF1,000,000)

Member Governments with outstanding 2019 pledges are urged to transfer their pledges as soon as possible. All Member Governments, who have not yet done so, are urged to make their 2020 contribution as soon as possible. In addition, Member Governments, who may be in a position to do so, may wish to consider making a multi-year pledge.

#### **In-kind Contributions**

The Secretary of the IPCC recognizes with appreciation the Member Governments and organizations that provided in-kind contributions to the IPCC during 2019. A list of in-kind contributions is provided in *IPCC-LII/Doc.2*, *Rev.1*, on the IPCC Trust Fund Programme and Budget. Also recognized are Chile and UNFCCC for providing the IPCC pavilion and meeting facilities, respectively, at COP-25 held in Madrid, Spain (December 2019).

#### **Update on the Outcome of Fundraising Meetings**

The Chair of the IPCC and the Secretary of the IPCC have met with high-level representatives of governments as well as with regional and international organizations in bilateral as well as multilateral settings during the course of 2019, notably on the margins of COP-25 which was held in Madrid, Spain, including Bahrain, European Parliament, FAO, Greece, Holy See, Hungary, IAEA, Iceland, India, Ireland, Luxembourg, Malaysia, Nepal, Norway, Poland, Saudi Arabia, Singapore, Slovenia, Switzerland, UNCCD, United Kingdom and UN Headquarters.


