



The IPCC Scholarship Programme

The Intergovernmental Panel on Climate Change (IPCC) developed its scholarship programme after receiving the Nobel Peace Prize in December 2007. The prestigious award recognised IPCC's efforts to "...build up and disseminate greater knowledge about man-made climate change and to lay the foundations for the measures that are needed to counteract such change." Therefore the IPCC decided that the best way to use the Nobel Prize money was to invest in post-graduate education for young scientists.



The aim of the Programme is to provide scholarships for PhD students from developing countries for research that advances the understanding of the scientific basis of risks of climate change, its potential impacts, and options for adaptation and mitigation. Students from Least Developed Countries (LDCs) and Small Island Developing States (SIDS) are particularly encouraged to apply
